(2) "Certificate" means this Certificate of Approval (Air) issued in accordance with Section 9 of the Act;

(3) "Company" means Reese Products of Canada Ltd., Oakville, Ontario;

(4) "Director" means any Ministry employee appointed by the Minister pursuant to Section 5 of the Act;

(5) "Environmental Appeal Board" means the Environmental Review Tribunal, as defined in The Environmental Review Tribunal Act, as amended from time to time.

(6) "Equipment" means the exhaust system, including the fume hood and fan, described in the Company's application, this Certificate and in the supporting documentation referred to herein, to the extent approved by this Certificate;

(7) "Manual" means a document or a set of documents that provide written instructions to staff of the Company;

(8) "Ministry" means the Ontario Ministry of the Environment.

You are hereby notified that this approval is issued to you subject to the terms and conditions outlined below:

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE

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The Company shall ensure that the Equipment is properly operated and maintained at all times. The Company shall:

1.1 Prepare, not later than three (3) months after the date of this Certificate, and update, as necessary, a Manual outlining the operating procedures and a maintenance program for the Equipment, including:

(a) routine operating and maintenance procedures in accordance with good engineering practices and as recommended by the Equipment suppliers;

(b) emergency procedures, and

(c) procedures for any record keeping activities relating to operation and maintenance of the Equipment;

1.2 Implement the recommendations of the operating Manual; and

1.3 Retain, for a minimum of two (2) years from the date of their creation, all records on maintenance, repair and inspection of the Equipment, and make these records available for review by staff of the Ministry upon request.

The reasons for the imposition of these terms and conditions are as follows:

1. Conditions 1.1 through 1.3 are included to emphasize that the Equipment must be maintained and operated according to a procedure that will result in compliance with the Act, the regulations and this Certificate. In addition, the Company is required to keep records and to provide information to staff of the Ministry upon request so that compliance with the Act, the regulations and this Certificate can be verified.

In accordance with Section 139 of the <u>Environmental Protection Act</u>, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter E-19, as amended, you may by written Notice served upon me, the Environmental Appeal Board and in accordance with Section 47 of the <u>Environmental</u> <u>Bill of Rights</u>, S.O. 1993, Chapter 28, the Environmental Commissioner, within 15 days after receipt of this Notice, require a hearing by the Board. The Environmental Commissioner will place notice of your appeal on the Environmental Registry. Section 142 of the <u>Environmental Protection Act</u>, provides that the Notice requiring the hearing shall state:

1. The portions of the approval or each term or condition in the approval in respect of which the hearing is required, and;

2. The grounds on which you intend to rely at the hearing in relation to each portion appealed.

The Notice should also include:

3. The name of the appellant;

4. The address of the appellant;

5. The Certificate of Approval number;

6. The date of the Certificate of Approval;

7. The name of the Director;

8. The municipality within which the works are located;

And the Notice should be signed and dated by the appellant.
